International Conference on 'Transboundary Rivers of South Asia: Fostering Regional Collaboration for Environmental Sustainability' (7-8 May 2024)

The International Conference on 'Transboundary Rivers of South Asia: Fostering Regional Collaboration for Environmental Sustainability' was held on 7-8 May 2024 at North South University, Dhaka, Bangladesh. This was jointly organized by the South Asian Institute of Policy and Governance (SIPG), North South University, Bangladesh, and the Department of Geography, University of Manchester (UoM), United Kingdom, the National River Conservation Commission (NRCC), Bangladesh and the associate partner was the South Asian Network for Public Administration (SANPA). A total of 40 papers were presented at the conference by authors from Bangladesh, India, Nepal, the United Kingdom, Turkiye and Kenya. There were around 60 participants of which 30 were international, mostly from India. An edited volume will be published from the selected papers of the conference by CRC Press, Routledge-Taylor & Francis Group.

SIPG hosted the NASPAA Student Simulation Competition

(24 February 2024)

SIPG hosted graduate students to participate in the 2024 NASPAA Simulation Competition. This is the third time NSU hosted the simulation competition. It is a collaboration between SIPG, DMS Academy, and the Network of Schools of Public Policy, Affairs, and Administration (NASPAA), connecting students around the world at a virtual site and 12 global host sites, including Bangladesh, Egypt, Brazil, Hungary, Nebraska, Texas, Michigan and more! The participants from Bangladesh were graduate students from North South University (NSU), the University of Chittagong, Jahangirnagar University, the University of Dhaka, and Jagannath University. The simulation competition tackled policy issues associated with forced migration through computer-based simulated gameplay. Created and improved by experts at DMS Academy who utilized extensive real-world data, the simulation placed students in leadership roles within a time-sensitive, fast-paced environment where they worked together to solve complex policy issues.

Academic writing workshop (25-28 March 2024)

Tribhuvan University, University of Nottingham International, and North South University united to launch 'Nurturing Social Justice Network of Academics: A Reflexive Writing Training in South Asia from Excluded Communities.' This program aimed to empower participants with advanced academic writing skills essential for international publishing.

Academic Programs

Continuing Joint PhD Program

SIPG is continuing the joint PhD Program with the University of Amsterdam, Netherlands. Two students are enrolled in this program: one Bangladeshi student from North South University (NSU) and one Dutch student from the University of Amsterdam, who have already started their PhD. The PhD students are jointly supervised by faculty members of SIPG, NSU, and the University of Amsterdam. The University of Amsterdam will award the PhD degree.

Master in Public Policy and Governance (MPPG)

MPPG's new batch (11th Batch) started again in the Summer 2023 semester. There are ten students, of which two are from Sri Lanka. The Bangladeshi students are mostly civil servants. A new intake of the MPPG 12th batch will be enrolled in the Spring 2025 semester.

The research, which was funded by the Covid-19 Learning, Evidence and Research Programme in Bangladesh (CLEAR) of the Institute of Development Studies, Sussex, focused on how during Covid 19 innovations in digitalization of Public Service delivery has changed organizational culture in government and, some cases, it also posed particular challenges.


Ambassadorial Talk-Session 4: South Korean Ambassador to Bangladesh Talked on Modern Korea (12 February 2024)

Center for Migration Studies (CMS) Coordinator Dr. Selim Reza and Ex-Coordinator Dr. Jalal Uddin Sikder attended a two-day workshop (21-22 February 2024) in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia on "Labor Migration Patterns and Their Role in Economic Diversification and Sustainable Development in Saudi Arabia: Acceptance and the Resistance towards Achieving Saudi Vision 2030" organised by the King Faisal Center for Research and Islamic Studies (KFCRIS). They have presented a research paper on labour protection issues of Bangladeshi migrant workers working on a "free visa" in Saudi Arabia. Several prominent academics and practitioners attended the workshop and shared constructive feedback on the research paper presented by Dr. Reza and Dr. Sikder. This research paper will be published soon. They also exchanged ideas with the workshop organiser and explored potential opportunities for collaboration between NSU's South Asian Institute of Policy and Governance (SIPG) and the King Faisal Center for Research and Islamic Studies (KFCRIS).

The 2nd International Dialogue on the Governance of Refugee Camps (IDGRC) recognizes the tragedies faced by fellow humans who have been subjected to human-inflicted atrocities for decades. Their names and faces remain unknown but their experiences need to be counted. The organizers of the dialogue think that they can lend our knowledge and expertise to try to ease their hardship. The Dialogue focuses on the governance of refugee camps. Six key areas were identified for exploration: law, policy, and management; camp typologies; camp life cycles; organizational ecosystems; intersectionality and identity; and refugee agency, voice, and mobilization. The venue of the second Dialogue was at Harokopio University on May 27-29, 2024. Out of 27 papers, 3 were on the Rohingya issue presented by 3 Bangladeshi academicians (who work in the UK, Norway, and Bangladesh) and one of them was a member of CPS of NSU Dr. Ishrat Zakia Sultana. Her paper was on the organizational ecosystem of the Rohingya camps in Bangladesh, which is based on her ongoing research jointly with Dr. Hasan Muhammad Baniamin.
